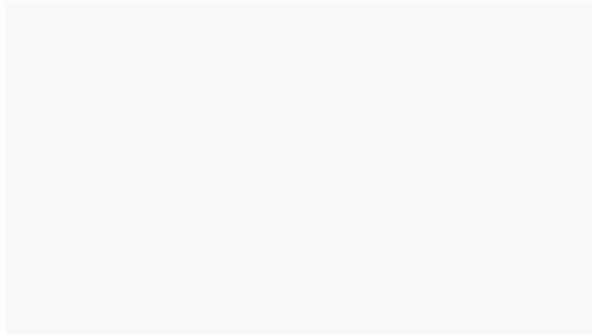

These activities bring people together and show our thanks. You can also hold a moment of silence or a small ceremony for veterans.

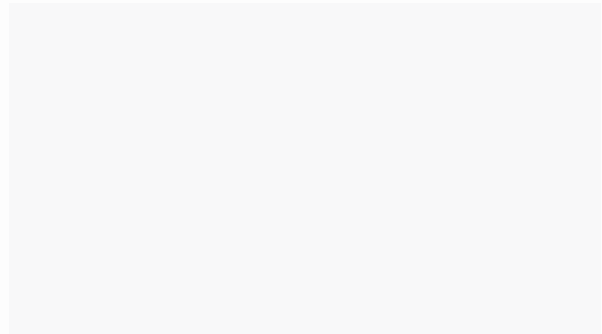
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
