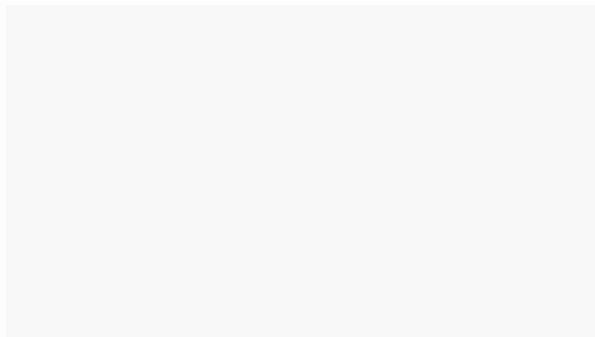

Take your time, ask for advice, and make sure your project follows the rules. Good luck with your Eagle Scout project!

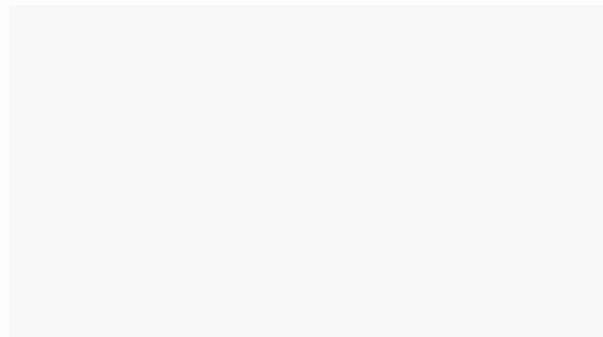

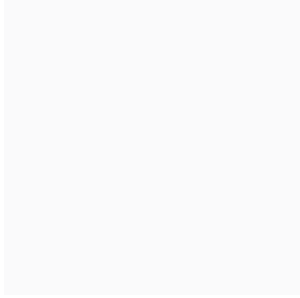
