He passed away nine days later, on October 24, 1972.

When Was 42 Retired?

Jackie Robinson's number **42** was **retired across all Major League Baseball teams on April 15, 1997**, the 50th anniversary of his debut. He is the only player in MLB history to have his number universally retired. However, players who were already wearing **42** at

the time were allowed to continue using it until they retired, including **Mariano Rivera, the last player to wear 42.**

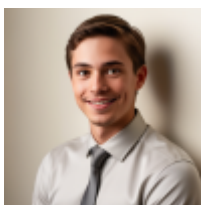
